EDUCATION FOR HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS IS CRITICAL

Healthcare providers in the District are on the front lines of suicide prevention.

Educating these medical professionals through continuing medical education on suicide risk assessment, treatment and management to provide comprehensive care for at-risk patients can help further reduce the number of District residents who die by suicide each year.
